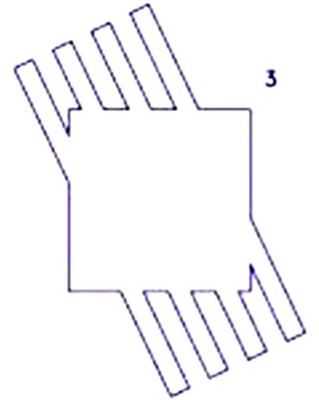

beGeesterd is an interuniversitary centre for philosophy and psychiatry in Flanders (Belgium) founded in 2018. Its goal is to support this emerging research field.



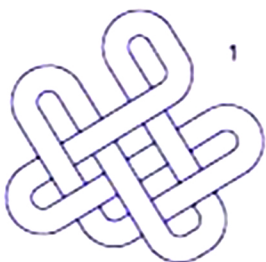

04/09 Jasper Feyaerts on the phenomenology of psychosis



Jasper Feyaerts is a psychologist, psychoanalyst and researcher at Ghent University. Jasper Feyaerts graduated in psychology in Ghent and studied philosophy in Leuven. He then worked in the psychiatric hospital Bethaniën in Zoersel, in psychosis care. His research focuses among others on Lacan & Merleau-Ponty on psychotic experience.

04/09: Gert-Jan van Aken & Kinge Berends on ethics of early detection, the case of autism

Gert-Jan Vanaken is a medical doctor and trainee in child and adolescent psychiatry. He is currently working on a PhD at KU Leuven and University of Antwerp on the ethics of early detection and intervention in autism.

Kinge Berends studied medicine and philosophy at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel and is currently specializing in psychiatry. Philosophically, she focuses on and conceptual preconditions for the development of a person-centred psychiatry. She is co-founder and president of beGeesterd, an interuniversity centre for philosophy and psychiatry in Flanders (Belgium). She spoke on the VVGG congress of 2018 on the importance of moral knowledge in the organization of mental health care.



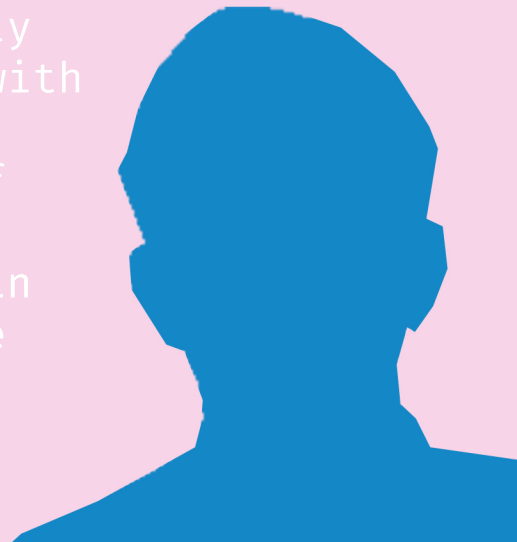
11/09: Bert van den Bergh & Thomas Fuchs on depression as an attunement disorder

Thomas Fuchs is professor of psychiatry and philosophy at the University of Heidelberg where he heads the research group "Phenomenological Psychopathology and Psychotherapy". He is also a coordinating project leader involved in a wide range of national and international research projects such as the EU Marie Curie Research Training Network "TESIS - Towards an Embodied Science of Intersubjectivity", "DISCOS - Disorders and Coherence of the Embodied Self" and the Joint National Research Project "The brain as an organ of interrelations - Interdisciplinary perspectives on the development of socially induced capacities". He is the author of more than 300 scientific publications and is also an editorial board member associated with a number of scientific journals, including the journal "Psychopathology".

Bert van den Bergh Bert van den Bergh studied psychology and philosophy at the University of Amsterdam. He has been a lecturer in cultural studies since 1997 at the European Studies study program at The Hague University. He is also a member of the Phenomenology & Psyche study group, under the auspices of the Society for Phenomenological Philosophy, and is co-manager of the international and interdisciplinary network Social Pathologies of Contemporary Civilization. He recently obtained his PhD at Erasmus University with the thesis 'The stolen disorder - A cultural-philosophical interpretation of the 'depression epidemic'. In 2019 a revision of this dissertation appeared in book form for a wider audience under the title "De Schaduw van de zwarte hond".

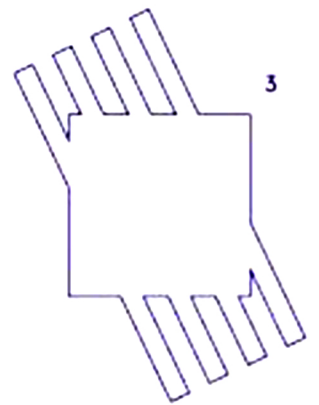


Adriaan Severins (°1990) works as a sound artist, performer and coach. In his continuous motion between artistic fields, he starts with tuning in and interacting with the existing context.

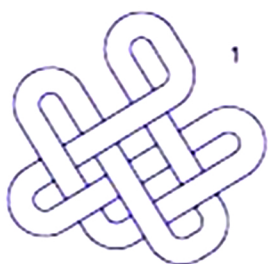

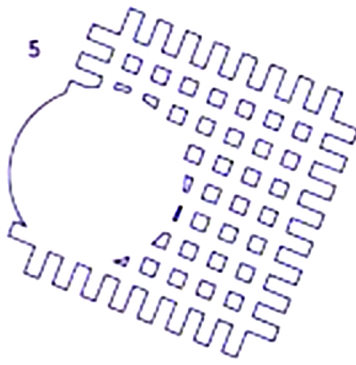
